10 Tips to CONNECT

- It's never too early or too late to make a connection. If you feel like you missed your shot to introduce yourself, try again in a few minutes. All you need to do is say hello.
- Introduce yourself with your preferred name. Prepare an elevator pitch to get the conversation started. A great pitch should include who you are, what you do, and what you hope to achieve.
- Other people's names can be tough to remember, especially when you are meeting a lot of people at once. Repeat new names you learn during your conversations to commit them to memory. "It's nice to meet you too, James."
- Keep it professional and positive. Some good topics to choose from –academics, career interests and goals, hometowns, interests and hobbies, the event. Avoid politics, religion, the weather, and personal issues.
- Keep the conversation relaxed and easy, like you are talking to a professor or peer. Remember that you are human, not a robot.
- Close the conversation by exchanging contact info, such as an email or phone number. At the end of the event, consider saying goodbye to those you have met.
- Follow up with any agreements you've made, like sending your resume or connecting on Cane2Cane and LinkedIn.
- If you are unsure of what to talk about, remember you have at least one thing in common: the U.
- Take notes to keep track of what you talked about with people, and use those notes in any follow-up communication.
